Leigh Ann Skeens-Wilson, Assistant Director, Winston Salem Regional Office

Leigh Ann Skeens-Wilson was appointed as Assistant Director in January 2013. She assists the Director in operational elements of the regional office's benefits delivery areas. Most recently she was the Deputy Director of VA's Education Service, administering benefits under the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Cheyenna Irwin began her career with the VA in 2011 as a Vocational Rehabilitation Intern with the Des Moines Regional Office, where she was later appointed to a position as Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor in January 2012. In June 2016, she was promoted to Supervisory Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor with the Winston-Salem Regional Office, Fort Bragg Out-based site. She has 16 years of experience in the Vocational Rehabilitation field, of which 8 years have been in a leadership or management role.

DeAnne Seekins, Network Director of the Department of Veterans Affairs Mid-Atlantic Health Care Network (VISN 6)

In July 2017, DeAnne Seekins was appointed Network Director of VISN 6. Ms. Seekins is the Chief Executive Officer of Veterans Health Administration medical facilities in North Carolina and Virginia, serving a population of more than 1.5 million veterans. The network is made up of seven medical centers and 34 outpatient sites of care, staffed by more than 17,000 people and operating with a budget exceeding \$3 billion. Ms. Seekins previously held VA Medical Center Director positions at the Durham VA Health Care System (DVAHCS) since June 2012 and Hampton VAMC from July 2009 – June 2012. Prior appointments include the Richmond VAMC, where she served as Associate Director from January 2007 – July 2009. During this period, she also served Veterans and the medical center as the Acting Director, July 2008 – February 2009. Ms. Seekins has been with the Department of Veterans Affairs since 1984.
